** Please remember to use Sunscreen, wear a hat & sunglasses and drink plenty of water **


Wednesday, July 31st

9am Space View Parks and American Space Museum. \$25/pp

Walk through history of space from the Chinese discovery of Rockets in 3rd century BC to Space Station Freedom. The Parks are dedicated to those that have served and worked in the space program since very early days. They include Mercury, Gemini and the Shuttle. They are located along the river, providing a wonderful view of the VAB (Vehicle Assembly Building) Also, A great location to watch a rocket launch (we hope there will be

a launch during our Reunion) It is a good possibility to catch a glimpse of an Alligator, Dolphin or even a Manatee.

After a walk through the Parks we will visit the American Space Museum & Walk of Fame to have a private tour of a collection of memorabilia gathered from private collectors. The exhibits display everything from spacecraft parts to astronaut's suits. They are working consoles and Soviet Cosmonaut mementos.

2 pm American Police Hall of Fame \$18

Founded in 1960, the American Police Hall of Fame and Museum is the nation's first law enforcement museum and memorial dedicated to American law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty.



Dedicated to the law enforcement officers who have made the ultimate sacrifice, the Memorial serves as a place of remembrance for many families and friends.

The Museum, through interactive displays, simulators and nearly 11,000 artifacts, educates the public about the history and current trends in American law enforcement. Students can learn about safety, science, forensics and so much more!
